1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to education finance; authorizing funding for staff development for
1.3 school districts with schools not making adequate yearly progress; appropriating
1.4 money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 122A.61, by adding a
1.5 subdivision.

1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 122A.61, is amended by adding a
1.8 subdivision to read:

1.9 Subd. 3. **Supplementary staff development aid.** (a) A school district that is
1.10 categorized by the Department of Education as either "not making sufficient progress"
1.11 or "needs assistance" in reaching the levels of adequate yearly progress required by the
1.12 No Child Left Behind Act and that meets the qualifications of paragraph (d) is eligible
1.13 for supplementary staff development aid.

1.14 (b) Supplementary staff development aid equals two percent of the formula
1.15 allowance for that year times the number of adjusted marginal cost pupil units attending
1.16 sites within the school district that are categorized as not making sufficient progress or
1.17 needs assistance.

1.18 (c) The staff development aid received under this section must be reserved and used
1.19 for staff development activities under this section and section 122A.60. Supplementary
1.20 staff development aid must be allocated according to a plan adopted by the school board.

1.21 (d) In order to qualify for revenue under paragraph (a) a district must:

1.22 (1) operate a high school that has a mobility rate in excess of 25 percent;

1.23 (2) operate a school site where the percentage of free and reduced lunch eligible
1.24 students exceeds 50 percent; and

2.1 (3) be contiguous to, or have boundaries that include, a portion of a city that has
2.2 more than 60,000 residents.

2.3 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for revenue for fiscal year 2008.
