1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to capital improvements; authorizing spending to acquire and better
1.3 public lands and other improvements for health and human services programs;
1.4 authorizing the sale of state bonds; appropriating money.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS.**

1.7 The sums shown in the column under "Appropriations" are appropriated from the
1.8 bond proceeds fund, or another named fund, to the state agencies or officials indicated,
1.9 to be spent for public purposes. Appropriations of bond proceeds must be spent as
1.10 authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraph (a), to acquire
1.11 and better public land and buildings and other public improvements of a capital nature, or
1.12 as authorized by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 5, paragraphs (b) to (j), or
1.13 article XIV. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriations in this act are available until
1.14 the project is completed or abandoned subject to Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.642.

1.15 Sec. 2. **PRIORITIES.**

1.16 Subdivision 1. **General.** The Health Care and Human Services Finance Division
1.17 of the House Finance Committee prioritizes the appropriations in this act as provided
1.18 in this section.

1.19 Subd. 2. **High priorities.** (a) Department of Human Services: Moose Lake MSOP
1.20 expansion-phase 2; systemwide asset preservation/safety and security; systemwide
1.21 campus redevelopment, reuse, and demolition; Anoka—remodel west wing Miller
1.22 building; and Ah Gwah Ching Regional Treatment Center.

2.1 (b) Grants to political subdivisions: Hennepin County Medical Center and Native
 2.2 American Juvenile Treatment Center.

2.3 Subd. 3. **Medium.** Grants to political subdivisions: Multicounty chemical
 2.4 dependency treatment facility and correctional center, Remembering with Dignity, and
 2.5 Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare.

2.6 **Sec. 3. HUMAN SERVICES**

2.7 **Subdivision 1. Total Appropriation** **\$ 102,800,000**

2.8 To the commissioner of administration for
 2.9 the purposes specified in this section.

2.10 **Subd. 2. Moose Lake MSOP Expansion-Phase**
 2.11 **2** **90,000,000**

2.12 To design, construct, furnish, and equip
 2.13 phase 2 of the expansion of the Moose Lake
 2.14 Sex Offender Treatment Facility, including
 2.15 additional secure facilities for programming
 2.16 space and ancillary support/services
 2.17 facilities.

2.18 **Subd. 3. Systemwide Asset Preservation/Safety**
 2.19 **and Security** **5,000,000**

2.20 To repair, replace, and renew needs specific
 2.21 to the operations of each regional treatment
 2.22 center such as code deficiencies, safety
 2.23 hazards, security deficiencies, and health
 2.24 risks.

2.25 **Subd. 4. Systemwide Campus Redevelopment,**
 2.26 **Reuse, and Demolition** **4,500,000**

2.27 To repair, replace, and improve key building
 2.28 components and basic infrastructure
 2.29 necessary to redevelop and reuse surplus
 2.30 regional treatment center properties and to
 2.31 demolish buildings and campus infrastructure
 2.32 for current or future use.

2.33 **Subd. 5. Anoka-Remodel West Wing Miller**
 2.34 **Building** **380,000**

3.1 For design of renovation and construction of
 3.2 the Miller Building west wing as a clinical
 3.3 training, office, and support complex for the
 3.4 state-operated services system.

3.5 **Subd. 6. Ah Gwah Ching Regional Treatment**
 3.6 **Center**

400,000

3.7 For preparation and site development,
 3.8 including demolition of buildings
 3.9 and infrastructure, to implement the
 3.10 redevelopment and reuse of the Ah Gwah
 3.11 Ching Regional Treatment Center. If the
 3.12 campus is sold or transferred to a local unit
 3.13 of government, unspent portions of this
 3.14 appropriation may be granted to that local
 3.15 unit of government for the purposes stated in
 3.16 this subdivision.

 3.18 **SUBDIVISIONS**

3.19 **Subdivision 1. Total Appropriation**

\$ 36,960,000

3.20 To the commissioner of administration for
 3.21 the purposes specified in this section.

3.22 **Subd. 2. Hennepin County Medical Center**

28,000,000

3.23 To Hennepin County for acquisition of
 3.24 land and predesign, design, construction,
 3.25 furnishing, and equipping an outpatient clinic
 3.26 and health education facility at Hennepin
 3.27 County Medical Center that includes
 3.28 teaching clinics and an education center.

3.29 This appropriation is not available until at
 3.30 least \$146,000,000 has been committed to
 3.31 the project from nonstate sources.

3.32 **Subd. 3. Native American Juvenile Treatment**
 3.33 **Center**

6,000,000

4.1 To the commissioner of human services to
 4.2 design, construct, furnish, and equip a Native
 4.3 American juvenile treatment center on or
 4.4 near the White Earth Reservation.

4.5 **Subd. 4. Multicounty Regional Chemical**
 4.6 **Dependency Treatment Facility and**
 4.7 **Correctional Center** 300,000

4.8 To the commissioner of human services
 4.9 for predesign of a multicounty regional
 4.10 chemical dependency treatment facility and
 4.11 correctional center in west central Minnesota.
 4.12 The commissioner shall consult with the
 4.13 commissioner of corrections on the predesign
 4.14 of the facility.

4.15 **Subd. 5. Remembering with Dignity** 2,160,000

4.16 To the commissioner of human services for
 4.17 grave markers or memorial monuments for
 4.18 unmarked graves of deceased residents of
 4.19 state hospitals or regional treatment centers.

4.20 **Subd. 6. Gillette Children's Specialty**
 4.21 **Healthcare** 500,000

4.22 To Ramsey County to plan and design
 4.23 renovations for surgical suites and
 4.24 the pediatric intensive care unit. This
 4.25 appropriation is not available until at least
 4.26 \$500,000 has been committed to the project
 4.27 by nonstate sources.

4.28 **Sec. 5. BOND SALE AUTHORIZATION.**

4.29 To provide the money appropriated in this act from the bond proceeds fund, the
 4.30 commissioner of finance shall sell and issue bonds of the state in an amount up to \$..... in
 4.31 the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect prescribed by Minnesota Statutes, sections
 4.32 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, sections 4 to 7.

4.33 **Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

4.34 Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective the day following final enactment.
