1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 260C.193, subdivision 6, is amended to

1.8 Subd. 6. **Termination of jurisdiction.** The court may dismiss the petition or
1.9 otherwise terminate its jurisdiction on its own motion or on the motion or petition of any
1.10 interested party at any time. Unless terminated by the court, and except as otherwise
1.11 provided in this subdivision, the jurisdiction of the court shall continue until the individual
1.12 becomes 19 years of age if the court determines it is in the best interest of the individual
1.13 to do so. ~~Court jurisdiction under section 260C.007, subdivision 6, clause (14), may~~
1.14 ~~not continue past the child's 18th birthday.~~
