1.12 adjustments, for a group residential housing provider located in Stearns County that  
1.13 operates a 40-bed facility, that received financing through the Minnesota Housing Finance  
1.14 Agency Ending Long-Term Homelessness Initiative and serves chemically dependent  
1.15 clientele, providing 24-hour-a-day supervision.
