1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to health; extending the essential community provider designation to
1.3 a mental health provider located in Hennepin County; amending Minnesota
1.4 Statutes 2006, section 62Q.19, subdivision 2.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 62Q.19, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

1.7 Subd. 2. **Application.** (a) Any provider may apply to the commissioner for
1.8 designation as an essential community provider by submitting an application form
1.9 developed by the commissioner. Except as provided in paragraph (d), applications must be
1.10 accepted within two years after the effective date of the rules adopted by the commissioner
1.11 to implement this section.

1.12 (b) Each application submitted must be accompanied by an application fee in an
1.13 amount determined by the commissioner. The fee shall be no more than what is needed to
1.14 cover the administrative costs of processing the application.

1.15 (c) The name, address, contact person, and the date by which the commissioner's
1.16 decision is expected to be made shall be classified as public data under section 13.41. All
1.17 other information contained in the application form shall be classified as private data
1.18 under section 13.41 until the application has been approved, approved as modified, or
1.19 denied by the commissioner. Once the decision has been made, all information shall be
1.20 classified as public data unless the applicant designates and the commissioner determines
1.21 that the information contains trade secret information.

1.22 (d) The commissioner shall accept an application for designation as an essential
1.23 community provider until June 30, ~~2004~~ 2007, from one applicant that is a nonprofit
1.24 community ~~services agency certified as a medical assistance provider that provides mental~~

2.1 ~~health, behavioral health, chemical dependency, employment, and health wellness services~~
2.2 ~~to the underserved Spanish-speaking Latino families and individuals with locations in~~
2.3 ~~Minneapolis and St. Paul~~ mental health agency located in Hennepin County that partners
2.4 with the Minneapolis public school system to provide mental health services to school-age
2.5 children and their families and provides mental health services to immigrant communities.

2.6 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
