The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety and Civil Justice

1.1 A bill for an act  
1.2 relating to public safety; requiring persons convicted of crimes of violence to  
1.3 register under the predatory offender law; proposing coding for new law in  
1.4 Minnesota Statutes, chapter 243; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2006, section  
1.5 243.167.

1.6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.7 Section 1. **[243.168] REGISTRATION UNDER PREDATORY OFFENDER LAW**  
1.8 **FOR CRIMES OF VIOLENCE.**

1.9 Subdivision 1. **Definitions.** As used in this section, "crime of violence" means a  
1.10 violation of any of the following or a similar law from another state or of the United States:

1.11 (1) a felony conviction of the following offenses: sections 609.165, subdivision 1b  
1.12 (unlawful possession of a firearm); 609.185, clauses (1), (3), (4), (5), (6), and (7) (murder  
1.13 in the first degree); 609.19 (murder in the second degree); 609.195 (murder in the third  
1.14 degree); 609.20 (manslaughter in the first degree); 609.205 (manslaughter in the second  
1.15 degree); 609.215 (aiding suicide and aiding attempted suicide); 609.221 (assault in the  
1.16 first degree); 609.222 (assault in the second degree); 609.223 (assault in the third degree);  
1.17 609.2231 (assault in the fourth degree); 609.229 (crimes committed for the benefit of  
1.18 a gang); 609.235 (use of drugs to injure or facilitate crime); 609.24 (simple robbery);  
1.19 609.245 (aggravated robbery); 609.377 (malicious punishment of a child); 609.378  
1.20 (neglect or endangerment of a child); 609.486 (commission of crime while wearing or  
1.21 possessing a bullet-resistant vest); 609.52 (involving theft of a firearm, theft involving  
1.22 the intentional taking or driving of a motor vehicle without the consent of the owner or  
1.23 authorized agent of the owner, theft involving the taking of property from a burning,  
1.24 abandoned, or vacant building, or from an area of destruction caused by civil disaster,  
1.25 riot, bombing, or the proximity of battle, and theft involving the theft of a controlled

2.1 substance, an explosive, or an incendiary device); 609.561 (arson in the first degree);  
2.2 609.562 (arson in the second degree); 609.582, subdivision 1, 2, or 3 (burglary in the first  
2.3 through third degrees); 609.66, subdivision 1e (drive-by shooting); 609.67 (unlawfully  
2.4 owning, possessing, operating a machine gun or short-barreled shotgun); 609.71 (riot);  
2.5 609.713 (terroristic threats); 609.749 (harassment and stalking); 609.855, subdivision 5  
2.6 (shooting at a public transit vehicle or facility);

2.7 (2) a felony-level violation of chapter 152 (drugs, controlled substances); and  
2.8 (3) an attempt to commit any of these offenses.

2.9 Subd. 2. **When required.** (a) In addition to the requirements of section 243.166, a  
2.10 person shall also register under section 243.166 if the person is convicted of a crime of  
2.11 violence.

2.12 (b) A person who was previously required to register in any state and who has  
2.13 completed the registration requirements of that state shall again register under section  
2.14 243.166 if the person commits a crime of violence.
