The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Safety and Civil Justice

1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to criminal justice; permitting courts to impose consecutive sentences for
1.3 certain repeat offenders; amending Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 609.1095,
1.4 by adding a subdivision.

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 609.1095, is amended by adding a
1.7 subdivision to read:

1.8 Subd. 5. **Permissive consecutive sentences for offenders with six or more**
1.9 **criminal history points.** If a person is convicted of a felony and the person has six
1.10 or more criminal history points, the judge may impose and execute a sentence that is
1.11 consecutive to any other sentence that the offender is required to serve.

1.12 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2008, and applies to crimes
1.13 committed on or after that date.
