



2.1 (d) Within six months before the expiration date of the designation as a star lake  
2.2 or river, a lake association may apply to continue the star lake or river designation under  
2.3 this section.

2.4 Subd. 3. **Eligibility.** A lake association applying for designation as a star lake  
2.5 or river must:

2.6 (1) develop and update a comprehensive lake or river management plan as provided  
2.7 in subdivision 4;

2.8 (2) maintain a membership or participation of at least 50 percent of the private  
2.9 shoreland owners;

2.10 (3) participate in the Pollution Control Agency's citizen water quality monitoring  
2.11 program under section 115.06, subdivision 4; and

2.12 (4) meet at least annually with staff from the Department of Natural Resources and  
2.13 other appropriate state agencies in the development and monitoring of the comprehensive  
2.14 lake or river management plan.

2.15 Subd. 4. **Comprehensive lake or river management plan.** (a) A comprehensive  
2.16 lake or river management plan must include a summary of adopted shoreland zoning  
2.17 ordinances in the area and any specific further restrictions supported by the lake  
2.18 association and must address:

2.19 (1) increases in native vegetation in the littoral area of the lake or river, when  
2.20 appropriate;

2.21 (2) increases in native vegetation on the shoreline areas of the lake or river, when  
2.22 appropriate;

2.23 (3) prevention, reduction, or elimination of aquatic invasive species in the lake  
2.24 or river;

2.25 (4) increasing or maintaining a healthy diverse fishery that is appropriate for the  
2.26 lake or river;

2.27 (5) how the lake association will assure its involvement with total maximum daily  
2.28 load stakeholder processes for any impaired waters that are identified within the watershed  
2.29 of the lake or river;

2.30 (6) how the lake association will assure its involvement in public input opportunities  
2.31 for various local comprehensive and project-specific planning and zoning processes;

2.32 (7) how the lake association will train and supply volunteers through approved  
2.33 programs to generate data needed by state and local agencies in an appropriate format;

2.34 (8) education opportunities for shoreland owners and other entities that conduct  
2.35 activities affecting the quality of the lake or river; and

3.1 (9) other activities that will coordinate with or enhance other state and local water  
3.2 management efforts.

3.3 (b) The comprehensive lake or river management plan shall be updated within five  
3.4 years of adoption by the lake association.

3.5 Subd. 5. **State resources.** State agencies may consider star lake or river designation  
3.6 in determining the allocation of financial and staff resources.

3.7 Subd. 6. **Board duties.** (a) The board must work with private and public entities  
3.8 to leverage the resources available to achieve maximum results for Minnesota star lakes  
3.9 or rivers. The board may assist lake associations with finding appropriate technical  
3.10 and financial assistance that is available and make recommendations to state agencies  
3.11 regarding the manner in which technical or financial assistance can be most effectively  
3.12 delivered. To the extent that money is available, the board may provide direct financial  
3.13 assistance to meet specific needs of lake associations, when financial assistance is not  
3.14 otherwise available, for:

3.15 (1) completing a comprehensive lake or river management plan when the lake  
3.16 association does not have an existing management plan and the association is committed  
3.17 to the goals of a plan, as specified in subdivision 4; and

3.18 (2) addressing specific issues of the lake or river to achieve or maintain the goals  
3.19 of the lake or river management plan for lake associations that have achieved a star lake  
3.20 or river designation.

3.21 (b) By December 1 of each even-numbered year, the board shall submit a report to  
3.22 the legislature on the activities for which money has been or will be spent for the current  
3.23 biennium, the applications for designation, and the star lakes or rivers designated by  
3.24 the board.

3.26 Subdivision 1. **Authority to erect.** (a) A county, statutory or home rule charter  
3.27 city, or town of Minnesota that contains a star lake or river designated under section  
3.28 103B.701 may request the Department of Transportation to erect star lake or river signs  
3.29 under section 161.139. One sign may be erected at each approach to a lake or river within  
3.30 the right-of-way of an interstate or other highway that passes over the lake or river in the  
3.31 Department of Transportation's eight-county metropolitan district or near or over the  
3.32 lake or river in greater Minnesota.

3.33 (b) An official lake or river sign on the right-of-way of an interstate or other highway  
3.34 may be replaced with a star lake or river sign by the Department of Transportation under  
3.35 section 161.139.

4.1            Subd. 2. **Sign standards.** The Department of Transportation shall design and  
4.2 manufacture the star lake and river signs to specifications not contrary to other federal  
4.3 and state highway sign standards.

4.4            **Sec. 3. CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**

4.5            By January 15, 2009, the Board of Water and Soil Resources shall submit  
4.6 recommendations to the chairs of the house and senate committees having jurisdiction  
4.7 over natural resources for the composition and authority of a citizens advisory committee  
4.8 to provide input to the board on the process of designating lakes and rivers under  
4.9 Minnesota Statutes, section 103B.701.
