3.5 for transportation.

3.13 classes listed in this subdivision and issue licenses classified accordingly.

 4.26 to read:

4.27 Subd. 2b. Exception for type III school bus drivers. (a) Notwithstanding
 4.28 subdivision 2, paragraph (c), the holder of a class D driver's license, without a school bus
 4.29 endorsement, may operate a type III school bus described in section 169.01, subdivision 6,
 4.30 clause (5), under the conditions in paragraphs (b) through (n).

4.31 (b) The operator is an employee of the entity that owns, leases, or contracts for
 4.32 the school bus.

4.33 (c) The operator's employer has adopted and implemented a policy that provides for
 4.34 annual training and certification of the operator in:

4.35 (1) safe operation of a type III school bus;
