To Pass as Amended and re-referred to the Committee on Finance

1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to transportation finance; appropriating money and reducing
1.3 appropriations for transportation purposes; deleting surcharge; modifying driver
1.4 licensing examination and fee requirements; amending Minnesota Statutes 2006,
1.5 section 171.29, subdivision 1; Laws 2008, chapter 152, article 1, section 6,
1.6 subdivision 2; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 168.123, subdivision
1.7 2a.

1.8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.9 Section 1. SUMMARY OF APPROPRIATIONS.

1.10 The amounts shown in this section summarize direct appropriations, by fund, made
1.11 in this act.

1.16 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATIONS.

1.17 The sums shown in the columns marked "Appropriations" are added to or, if shown
1.18 in parentheses, subtracted from the appropriations in Laws 2007, chapter 143, article 1, to
1.19 the agencies and for the purposes specified in this act. The appropriations are from the
1.20 general fund or another named fund and are available for the fiscal years indicated for
1.21 each purpose. The figures "2008" and "2009" used in this act mean that the addition to
1.22 or subtraction from the appropriation listed under them is available for the fiscal year
1.23 ending June 30, 2008, or June 30, 2009, respectively. Supplemental appropriations and
1.24 reductions to appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, are effective the
1.25 day following final enactment.

4.3 The base appropriation for fiscal years 2010
 4.4 and 2011 is \$3,296,000 per year.

4.5 Subd. 3. **Capitol Security** 0 (15,000)

4.6 This reduction is from the appropriation from
 4.7 the general fund in Laws 2007, chapter 143,
 4.8 article 1, section 5, subdivision 3, paragraph
 4.9 (c).

4.10 Subd. 4. **Driver and Vehicle Services** 0 12,000,000

4.11 This appropriation is from the trunk
 4.12 highway fund for research, development,
 4.13 deployment, and maintenance of a driver and
 4.14 vehicle services information system. This
 4.15 appropriation is available until June 30, 2010.

4.16 Sec. 6. Minnesota Statutes 2006, section 171.29, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

4.17 Subdivision 1. **Examination required.** No person whose driver's license has been
 4.18 revoked by reason of conviction, plea of guilty, or forfeiture of bail not vacated, under
 4.19 section 169.791, 169.797, ~~or~~ 171.17, or 171.172, or revoked under section 169.792
 4.20 or 169A.52 shall be issued another license unless and until that person shall have
 4.21 successfully passed an examination as required by the commissioner of public safety.
 4.22 This subdivision does not apply to an applicant for early reinstatement under section
 4.23 169.792, subdivision 7a.

4.24 Sec. 7. Laws 2008, chapter 152, article 1, section 6, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

4.25 Subd. 2. **Appropriation; study.** ~~\$325,000~~ \$300,000 is appropriated from the
 4.26 general fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota for the Center for
 4.27 Transportation Studies to complete a study to assess the public policy implications of
 4.28 financing new and improved transportation infrastructure in Minnesota through capturing
 4.29 the value of the benefits created, to prepare a report on its findings, and to conduct a
 4.30 series of workshops. This is a onetime appropriation and is available in fiscal years 2008
 4.31 and 2009.

4.32 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
