.8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
.9	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 43A.11, subdivision 7, is amended to read:
.10	Subd. 7. Ranking of veterans. Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications
.11	for a vacant position and claim disabled veteran's preference shall be listed in the applicant
.12	pool ahead of all other applicants. Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications for a
.13	vacant position and claim nondisabled veteran's preference shall be listed in the applicant
.14	pool after those claiming disabled veteran's preference and ahead of nonveterans. Each
.15	veteran or disabled veteran who meets minimum qualifications for a vacant position and
.16	has claimed a veterans or disabled veterans preference must be granted an interview for
.17	the position by the hiring authority.
.18	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective July 1, 2009, and applies to all
.19	appointments made on or after that date.

2.26	(9) the total number of veteran applicants identified in clause (8) who were hired
2.27	into the open positions of employment within the agency;
2.28	(10) the total number of veteran applicants identified in clause (6) who were sent a
2.29	rejection letter, in accordance with section 43A.11, subdivision 9; and
2.30	(11) any other data or information deemed important by the commissioner of
2.31	administration and reflecting on the efforts of the subject agency to recruit and hire
2.32	veterans.
