BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
Section 1. [609.807] PROHIBITION OF EARLY INTERNET SALES OF EVENT
TICKETS AT INFLATED PRICES.
Any person or entity that serves as the initial seller, over the Internet, of tickets
of admission to a sporting event, theater, musical performance, or place of public
entertainment or amusement of any kind, shall not:
(1) sell any ticket over the Internet at greater than face value, either itself or in
conjunction with any other ticket seller, until all tickets have been made available to the
general public at face value for at least seven days; or
(2) provide on its Web site a link, either directly or indirectly, to any individual or
entity that functions as a reseller of tickets sold by the initial seller.
For purposes of this section, "initial seller" does not include a person or entity that is
the person or entity that provides the event or provides the venue for the event.
EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective August 1, 2009, and applies to
