To Pass as Amended and re-referred to the Committee on Finance

1.1 A bill for an act
1.2 relating to public safety; providing for first- and second-degree sex trafficking;
1.3 increasing criminal penalties for certain sex trafficking offenses; adding sex
1.4 trafficking to the definition of crime of violence; amending Minnesota Statutes
1.5 2008, sections 609.281, subdivision 5; 609.321, subdivision 7a, by adding a
1.6 subdivision; 609.322; 611A.036, subdivision 7; 624.712, subdivision 5.

1.7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.8 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 609.281, subdivision 5, is amended to read:

1.9 Subd. 5. **Labor trafficking.** "Labor trafficking" means:

1.10 (1) the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring, enticement, provision,
1.11 obtaining, or receipt of a person by any means, whether a United States citizen or foreign
1.12 national, for the purpose of:

1.13 ~~(1)~~ (i) debt bondage or forced labor or services;

1.14 ~~(2)~~ (ii) slavery or practices similar to slavery; or

1.15 ~~(3)~~ (iii) the removal of organs through the use of coercion or intimidation; or

1.16 (2) receiving profit or anything of value, knowing or having reason to know it is
1.17 derived from an act described in clause (1).

3.22 accused may be prosecuted in any county in which one of the offenses was committed
