(a) By September 1, 2006, the commissioner of public safety shall report to the chairs of the senate and house of representatives committees and divisions having jurisdiction over criminal justice policy and funding a summary of its findings. - (2) hires or offers or agrees to hire an individual 18 years of age or older to engage in sexual penetration or sexual contact.

      - (1) engages in prostitution with an individual 18 years of age or above; or
    - (2) hires or offers or agrees to hire an individual 18 years of age or above to engage in sexual penetration or sexual contact. Except as otherwise provided in subdivision 4, a person who is convicted of violating this <del>clause or clause (1)</del> paragraph while acting as a patron must, at a minimum, be sentenced to pay a fine of at least \$500.
    - (b) Whoever violates the provisions of this subdivision within two years of a previous prostitution conviction may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than one year or to payment of a fine of not more than \$3,000, or both for violating this section or section 609.322 is guilty of a gross misdemeanor. Except as otherwise provided in subdivision 4,

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a person who is convicted of a gross misdemeanor violation of this subdivision violating this paragraph while acting as a patron, must, at a minimum, be sentenced as follows:

- (1) to pay a fine of at least \$1,500; and
- (2) to serve 20 hours of community work service.

The court may waive the mandatory community work service if it makes specific, written findings that the community work service is not feasible or appropriate under the circumstances of the case.
