1.8	sentence imposed by the court in the challenge incarceration program under sections
1.9	244.171 and 244.172 and has been discharged of the sentence either by order of the court
1.10	or by operation of law, may petition the Board of Pardons to grant a conditional partial
1.11	pardon.
1.12	(b) The Board of Pardons shall grant a conditional partial pardon that reduces the
1.13	person's conviction for a felony to a gross misdemeanor if the board determines that
1.14	the person:
1.15	(1) has successfully completed the challenge incarceration program; and
