1.8	Subd. 2d. Renewable residential heating. Up to ten percent of a utility's
1.9	conservation spending obligation under subdivision 1a or any amount expended in order
1.10	to satisfy a utility's energy-savings goal under subdivision 1c may be used for a project
1.11	located in this state that provides rebates to homeowners who install the following types of
1.12	projects to heat the homeowner's primary residence:
1.13	(1) a solar thermal project, as defined in section 216B.2411, subdivision 2, paragraph
1.14	(e), except that no rebate may be awarded to a solar thermal project that heats water;
1.15	(2) a geothermal project;
1.16	(3) a heating unit that burns exclusively either biodiesel, shelled corn, or wood chips
1.17	or wood pellets, provided that the heating unit is listed by Underwriters Laboratories.
1.18	A rebate awarded under this subdivision must not exceed the lesser of 25 percent of the
1.19	purchase and installation costs of the project or \$500.
