1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. RENEWABLE ENERGY GRANT PROGRAM.
1.6	(a) The commissioner of commerce shall establish a program to award grants to
1.7	energy projects that meet the following conditions:
1.8	(1) the project qualifies as a community-based energy development (C-BED) project,
1.9	as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 216B.1612, subdivision 2, paragraph (g);
1.10	(2) for wind projects, the project must be located in an area where the measured
1.11	wind resource is Class 4 or above;
1.12	(3) the project begins commercial operation after July 1, 2009;
1.13	(4) the project does not receive renewable energy payment incentives under
1.14	Minnesota Statutes, section 216C.41; and
1.15	(5) the project meets any other conditions established under the American Recovery
1.16	and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5, for use of these funds.
