1.7	An amendment to the Minnesota Constitution is proposed to the people. If the
1.8	amendment is adopted, article X, section 8, will read:
1.9	Sec. 8. (a) The legislature may authorize on-track parimutuel betting on horse racing
1.10	in a manner prescribed by law.
1.11	(b) The legislature may authorize an entity licensed to conduct parimutuel betting to
1.12	conduct other forms of gambling at a licensed horse racing facility and shall impose a tax
1.13	on gross gambling revenue in a manner prescribed by law. Revenue generated by the tax
