1.2 relating to business development; providing for a comparative study of state laws
1.3 affecting small business start-ups in Minnesota and Wisconsin; appropriating

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. **COMPARATIVE STUDY OF STATE REGULATION AFFECTING**
1.7 **SMALL BUSINESS START-UPS.**

1.8 (a) \$..... is appropriated for fiscal year 2011 from the general fund to the Legislative
1.9 Coordinating Commission to fund a grant for a comparative study of the effects of state
1.10 regulation on the cost and delay required to start a typical small business in Minnesota
1.11 and Wisconsin. This appropriation is available until spent.

1.12 (b) The study must examine the typical cost and delay required by state regulation in
1.13 the two states to start a typical small services business, small retail business, and small
1.14 manufacturing business. Within each of those three categories, the study must choose a
1.15 specific type of business and follow the start-up process in the two states from beginning
1.16 to end, including formation, financing, licensing, permits, reporting requirements,
1.17 employment laws, and state and local taxes. The study must result in a written report
1.18 submitted to the Legislative Coordinating Commission no later than December 1, 2011.

1.19 (c) The Legislative Coordinating Commission shall request proposals and choose
1.20 the recipient of the grant from among higher education institutions that have a graduate
1.21 program in business, business administration, or a similar field. The Legislative
1.22 Coordinating Commission shall periodically monitor the recipient's progress on the study
1.23 and written report. The Legislative Coordinating Commission shall submit the written
