Subdivision 1. Conditions. A meeting governed by this section and section 13D.01
subdivisions 1, 2, 4, and 5, may be conducted by telephone or other electronic means so
ong as the following conditions are met:
(1) the presiding officer, chief legal counsel, or chief administrative officer for
he affected governing public body determines that an in-person meeting or a meeting
conducted under section 13D.02 is not practical or prudent because of a health pandemic
or an emergency declared under chapter 12;
(2) all members of the body participating in the meeting, wherever their physical
ocation, can hear one another and can hear all discussion and testimony;
(3) members of the public present at the regular meeting location of the body
can hear all discussion and testimony and all votes of the members of the body, unless
attendance at the regular meeting location is not feasible due to the health pandemic or
emergency declaration;
(4) at least one member of the body, chief legal counsel, or chief administrative
officer is physically present at the regular meeting location, unless unfeasible due to the
nealth pandemic or emergency declaration; and

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(5) all votes are conducted by roll call, so each member's vote on each issue can be identified and recorded.

- Sec. 7. Minnesota Statutes 2008, section 13D.04, subdivision 2, is amended to read: Subd. 2. Special meetings. (a) For a special meeting, except an emergency meeting or a special meeting for which a notice requirement is otherwise expressly established by statute, the public body shall post written notice of the date, time, place, and purpose of the meeting on the principal bulletin board of the public body, or if the public body has no principal bulletin board, on the door of its usual meeting room. If the principal bulletin board or door of the public body's usual meeting room is not generally accessible to the public, the public body must post the notice in an area generally accessible for public viewing.
- (b) The notice shall also be mailed or otherwise delivered to each person who has filed a written request for notice of special meetings with the public body. This notice shall be posted and mailed or delivered at least three calendar days before the date of the meeting.
- (c) As an alternative to mailing or otherwise delivering notice to persons who have filed a written request for notice of special meetings, the public body may publish the notice once, at least three <u>calendar</u> days before the meeting, in the official newspaper of the public body or, if there is none, in a qualified newspaper of general circulation within the area of the public body's authority.
- (d) A person filing a request for notice of special meetings may limit the request to notification of meetings concerning particular subjects, in which case the public body is required to send notice to that person only concerning special meetings involving those subjects.
- (e) A public body may establish an expiration date for requests for notices of special meetings pursuant to this subdivision and require refiling of the request once each year.
- (f) Not more than 60 days before the expiration date of a request for notice, the public body shall send notice of the refiling requirement to each person who filed during the preceding year.
