1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [465.90] MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY TO PERMIT SOLICITATION
1.6	BY FIREFIGHTERS.
1.7	Notwithstanding any law or ordinance to the contrary, a municipality may by
1.8	resolution permit full-time permanent firefighters employed by the municipality to solicit
1.9	charitable contributions from motorists while on duty if the following conditions are met
1.10	(1) the solicitation is for only one charitable organization annually, and that
1.11	charitable organization is qualified under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
1.12	and is registered as a charity under state law;
1.13	(2) the solicitation does not occur for more than three days, whether or not
1.14	consecutively, in any calendar year; and
1.15	(3) the charitable organization provides to the municipality proof of commercial
1.16	general liability insurance against claims for bodily injury and property damage if the
1.17	injury or damage occurs (i) on public streets, roads, or rights-of-way, or (ii) as a result
1.18	of the solicitor's activities. The insurance must have a limit of no less than \$1,500,000
1.19	per occurrence. The certificate of insurance must name the municipality as an additional
1.20	insured.
