1.6	Section 1. [4.046] DEPARTMENT OF EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND
1.7	EDUCATION.
1.8	(a) The Department of Early Childhood Care and Education is established to
1.9	coordinate a high-quality early childhood system in Minnesota to make early childhood
1.10	care and education more effective and to improve the educational outcomes of children
1.11	from birth to kindergarten entrance. The governor shall appoint, and the senate shall
1.12	confirm, a commissioner who is a recognized expert in the field of early childhood
1.13	care and education who shall facilitate communication and coordinate early childhood
1.14	education and child care programs.
1.15	(b) The commissioner shall coordinate staff efforts to:
1.16	(1) consolidate and coordinate resources and public funding streams for early
1.17	childhood education and child care, and ensure the accountability and coordinated
1.18	development of all early childhood education and child care services to children from birth
