1.10	COMPANION ANIMAL BOARD
1.11	Section 1. [347.66] DEFINITIONS.
1.12	Subdivision 1. Scope. For the purposes of sections 347.66 to 347.72, the terms defined
1.13	in this section have the meanings given them.
1.14	Subd. 2. Animal shelter. "Animal shelter" means any not-for-profit organization with
1.15	tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code that: (i) accepts
1.16	animals into an animal-designated physical facility; (ii) is devoted to the rescue, care, and
1.17	adoption of stray, abandoned, unwanted, or surrendered animals; (iii) places animals in
1.18	permanent homes or with animal rescue organizations; and (iv) does not breed animals.
1.19	Subd. 3. Board. "Board" means the Companion Animal Board.
1.20	Subd. 4. Companion animal. "Companion animal" means a pet or companion animal
1.21	as defined in sections 343.20, subdivision 6; and 346.36, subdivision 6.

2.2	(a) The Companion Animal Board is created to protect and promote the welfare, social
2.3	well-being, and physical and mental health of companion animals. The board must serve
2.4	the broader community, including the public, state government, local governments, nonprofit
2.5	animal welfare organizations, and those dedicated to promoting and serving the health and
2.6	welfare of companion animals through the administration and enforcement of sections
2.7	<u>347.68 to 347.72.</u>
2.8	(b) Sections 347.67 to 347.72 do not apply to the care or treatment of an agricultural
2.9	animal or farm animal that is used for food, other farm or agricultural products, or other
2.10	agricultural uses.
2.11	(c) The Board of Animal Health has the authority to control and prevent dangerous and
2.12	reportable diseases for companion animals as governed by chapter 35.
2.13	Sec. 3. [347.68] BOARD STRUCTURE.
2.14	Subdivision 1. Members; officers. (a) The Companion Animal Board shall carry out
2.15	and enforce the purposes, powers, and duties of sections 347.67 to 347.72. The board has
2.16	13 members appointed by the governor represented by the following companion animal
2.17	interests and experience:
2.18	(1) two members must be accredited, licensed veterinarians who practice veterinary
2.19	medicine in this state;
2.20	(2) one member must be a Minnesota animal control officer, as defined in section 343.20,

2.23	the seven-county metropolitan area;

3.7	(b) Appointments to fill unexpired terms must be made from the classes to which the
3.8	retiring members belong. The board must elect a president and a vice-president from among
3.9	its members and a nonmember to be the board's executive director for a term of one year
3.10	and until a successor qualifies. The board must set the duties of the executive director.
3.11	(c) The board must meet at least quarterly. Officers must be elected each April.

All fees and penalties 5.7 collected by the board under this chapter or any money received by the board as gifts or 5.8 grants or other private or public funds obtained for the purposes of sections 347.68 to 347.71, 5.9 including contributions made under section 168.1283, subdivision 1, clause (4), must be 5.10 deposited in the state treasury and credited to the companion animal account in the special 5.11 revenue fund. 7.21	Subdivision 1. Members; officers. The board has six members appointed by the governor
7.22	with the advice and consent of the senate, four of whom are producers of livestock in the
7.23	state and at least one of the four livestock producers is also a member of a federally
7.24	recognized Tribe located in Minnesota, and two of whom are practicing veterinarians licensed
7.25	in Minnesota. The commissioners of agriculture, natural resources, and health, the dean of
7.26	the College of Veterinary Medicine, the executive director of the Companion Animal Board,
7.27	and the director of the Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory of the University of Minnesota
7.28	may serve as consultants to the board without vote. Appointments to fill unexpired terms
7.29	must be made from the classes to which the retiring members belong. The board shall elect
7.30	a president and a vice-president from among its members and a veterinarian licensed in
7.31	Minnesota who is not a member to be its executive director for a term of one year and until
7.32	a successor qualifies. The board shall set the duties of the director.

Subd. 4. Veterinary protocol. (a) A commercial breeder must establish and maintain 8.3 a written protocol for disease control and prevention, euthanasia, and veterinary care of 8.4 animals at each facility. The initial protocol must be developed under the direction and 8.5 supervision of the board. A commercial breeder must maintain a written protocol that is 8.6 updated at least every 12 months and that is signed and dated by the board or by a veterinarian 8.7 along with the commercial breeder. The written protocol must be available to the board 8.8 upon request or at the time of inspection. The Companion Animal Board must defer to and 8.9 cooperate with the Board of Animal Health on all matters related to the control and prevention 8.10 of reportable diseases. 8.11

(b) An animal sold or otherwise distributed by a commercial breeder must be accompanied 8.12 by a veterinary health certificate completed by a veterinarian. The certificate must be 8.13 completed within 30 days prior to the sale or distribution and must indicate that the animal 8.14 is current with vaccinations and has no signs of infectious or contagious diseases. The 8.15 certificate accompanying an adult dog that was not spayed or neutered must indicate that 8.16 the dog has no signs of infectious or contagious diseases and was tested for canine brucellosis 8.17 with a test approved by the board and found to be negative. The Companion Animal Board 8.18 8.19 must immediately report and provide copies of all disease-related testing, including canine brucellosis and other reportable diseases, to the Board of Animal Health. 8.20
